STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Providing for Protection of White Perch in Bear Pond, Situated in the Town of Hartford, in the County of Oxford, and in the Town of Turner, in the County of Androscoggin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. It shall be unlawful for any person, at any
time, to take, catch, kill or destroy, in any one day, more
than fifteen white perch in all in Bear Pond, which pond
is situated in the town of Hartford, in the county of Oxford, and in the town of Turner, in the county of
Androscoggin.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in pos-

- 2 session in any one day more than fifteen white perch in all 3 taken from said pond.
 - Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this section
- 2 shall pay a fine of not less than ten or more than thirty
- 3 dollars and costs for each offense, and one dollar additional
- 4 for each perch taken, caught, killed or had in possession in
- 5 violation of this act.
