STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Limit the Number of Pounds of Fish that May
Be Taken from Cobbosseecontee Stream and Connecting
Ponds, in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take or
2 have in possession in any one day, in the aggregate, more
3 than ten pounds of fish, before such fish are dressed, from
4 any of the following named waters, located in the county
5 of Kennebec, namely: From Cobbosseecontee stream, be-
6 tween Collins dam, so-called, and the upper dam at the city
7 of Gardiner, including the Ox Bow, so-called, and Horse-
8 shoe pond.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than
3 thirty dollars and costs for each offense.
