STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Eighteen of Chapter Thirty-five of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Entrance of Cattle into the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eighteen of chapter thirty-five of the revised

- 2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out all of the said
- 3 section after the words "the shipment" in the sixth line
- 4 thereof, and substituting in place thereof the following:
- 5 'Such animals may be tested with tuberculin within sixty
- 6 days of their arrival within the state whenever such test is
- 7 deemed necessary by the commissioner of agriculture or
- 8 his duly authorized agent in charge of the live stock

9 sanitary work, and whenever such animal or animals are 10 so held for a retest they shall be considered as being in II quarantine upon the premises of the owner. All persons 12 bringing animals into the state must conform to the regu-13 lations of the United States department of agriculture re-14 quiring that such animals be tuberculin tested within a 15 reasonable time prior to shipment, such test being ad-76 ministered by an inspector of the United States department 17 of agriculture, or by a veterinary authorized by said 18 United States department of agriculture to test for inter-19 state shipment, and a copy of the tuberculin test chart of 20 such test must also accompany the animal or animals so 21 tested whether brought into the state by steamship, rail-22 road, truck or any other conveyance, or driven on foot. 23 This ruling shall not, however, apply to calves under one 24 year of age from a fully accredited herd, nor to cattle 25 designed for immediate slaughter, but the latter must be 26 slaughtered within ten days after being brought into the 27 state under inspection that shall be acceptable to the com-28 missioner of agriculture or his duly authorized agent in 29 charge of the live stock sanitary work. Whoever violates 30 any provision of this section shall be punished as provided 31 in section seventeen,' so that said section as amended shall 32 read as follows:

'Sect. 18. No meat stock, (calves, cows, steers, oxen or 2 bulls), or stags of any age, shall be allowed to enter this 3 state, from any other state or country, either for dairying

4 purposes, breeding purposes or for slaughter, except cattle 5 in transit under the control of the federal government, 6 without a permit duly authorized by the live stock sanitary 7 commissioner, which permit shall accompany the ship-8 ment. Such animals may be tested with tuberculin within 9 sixty days of their arrival within the state whenever such to test is deemed necessary by the commissioner of agricul-II ture or his duly authorized agent in charge of the live 12 stock sanitary work, and whenever such animal or animals 13 are so held for a retest they shall be considered as being 14 in quarantine upon the premises of the owner. All persons 15 bringing animals into the state must conform to the regu-16 lations of the United States department of agriculture re-17 quiring that such animals be tuberculin tested within a 18 reasonable time prior to shipment, such test being ad-19 ministered by an inspector of the United States department 20 of agriculture, or by a veterinary authorized by said United 21 States department of agriculture to test for interstate ship-22 ment, and a copy of the tuberculin test chart of such test 23 must also accompany the animal or animals so tested 24 whether brought into the state by steamship, railroad, 25 truck, or any other conveyance, or driven on foot. This 26 ruling shall not, however, apply to calves under one year 27 of age from a fully accredited herd or to cattle designed for 28 immediate slaughter, but the latter must be slaughtered 20 within ten days after being brought into the state under 30 inspection that shall be acceptable to the commissioner of

31 agriculture or his duly authorized agent in charge of the 32 live stock sanitary work. Whoever violates any provision 33 of this section shall be punished as provided in section 34 seventeen.
