STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred and Forty-one of the Private and Special Laws of 1921, Relative to the office of City Clerk of the City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section six of chapter one hundred and forty-one of the
2 private and special laws of 1921 is hereby amended by
3 striking out the words "eighteen hundred dollars" in the
4 first and second lines of said section and inserting therein
5 the words 'two thousand dollars' and by striking out the
6 words "seven hundred and eighty dollars" in the fourth
7 and fifth lines of said section and inserting the words 'ten

8 hundred and forty dollars' in place thereof, so that said 9 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 6. Compensation; may require a deputy; auditor 2 shall direct manner of keeping books of account; shall 3 account for all fees monthly. The city clerk shall receive 4 an annual salary of two thousand dollars which shall be in 5 full compensation for the performance of all duties re-6 quired by said clerk. He may employ a chief clerk who 7 may serve as his deputy at a salary not exceeding ten 8 hundred and forty dollars annually. The clerk shall keep 9 books of account in such manner and form as the auditor 10 may direct. The said clerk shall account monthly under 11 oath and turn over to the city treasurer all fees received 12 by him or payable to him by virtue of his office.'
