STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Alonzo E. Peabody, of Dixmont, for State Pension.

RESOLVED: That the sum of twelve dollars per month 2 be paid to Alonzo E. Peabody, veteran of the civil war, 3 to be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for mili-4 tary pensions, beginning January first, nineteen hundred and 5 twenty-three, and continuing during the pleasure of the 6 legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Peabody enlisted in the civil war but did not stay long enough to get military state pension.

He is 78 years old, has a wife and very poor financially and in health. Either one of them are not able to do any work. They are stopping this winter with their daughter, who is also very poor, but manage to get enough to eat with a little outside help.
