STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-eight of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapters One Hundred Sixty-two, One Hundred Sixty-seven and Two Hundred Ninety-two of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seventeen, Chapter Two Hundred Fourteen, Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nineteen, and by Chapter Two Hundred Nineteen, Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Twenty-one, Relating to the Compensation of Judges of Probate in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-eight of chapter one hundred seventeen of

2 the revised statutes, as amended by chapters one hundred
3 fifty-two, one hundred sixty-seven and two hundred ninety-
4 two of the public laws of nineteen hundred seventeen; by
5 chapter two hundred fourteen, public laws of nineteen hun-
6 dred nineteen, and by chapter two hundred nineteen, pub-
7 lic laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one, is hereby further
8 amended by striking out the words "one thousand" and in-
9 serting in place thereof the words 'twelve hundred and
10 fifty,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 38. Judges of probate in the several counties shall
2 receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the counties
3 in monthly payments paid on the last day of each month,
4 as follows:

Androscoggin, sixteen hundred dollars.

Aroostook, fifteen hundred dollars.

Cumberland, three thousand dollars.

Franklin, six hundred dollars.

Hancock, fifteen hundred dollars.

Kennebec, two thousand dollars.

Knox, eight hundred dollars.

Lincoln, five hundred dollars.

Oxford, twelve hundred and fifty dollars.

Penobscot, eighteen hundred dollars.

Piscataquis, eight hundred dollars.

Sagadahoc, nine hundred dollars.

Somerset, twelve hundred dollars.

Waldo, seven hundred dollars.

Washington, twelve hundred dollars.

York, twenty-five hundred dollars, and the fees to which
2 they are entitled by law, except the fee provided in section
3 forty-nine of chapter one hundred and forty-five, shall be
4 taxed and collected and paid over by the registers of pro-
5 bate to the county treasurers for the use of their counties.'
