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**STATE OF MAINE**

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

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AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter One Hundred  
Forty-five, Revised Statutes, Relating to Hospital Trustees.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred forty-five of the re-  
2 vised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words  
3 "six men and one woman" in the fifth and sixth lines and  
4 inserting in place thereof the word 'seven,' so that said  
5 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 1. The government of the Augusta state hospital,  
2 established at Augusta, in the county of Kennebec, and of  
3 the Bangor state hospital, established at Bangor, in the  
4 county of Penobscot, and of the Maine school for feeble-

5 minded, established at Pownal, in the county of Cumber-  
6 land, is vested in a board of trustees consisting of seven  
7 inhabitants of the state, who shall be appointed by the  
8 governor, with the advice and consent of the council, for  
9 terms of four years. The board shall be known as “Hospi-  
10 tal Trustees.” Any vacancy occurring during a term shall  
11 be filled in like manner for the remainder of the unexpired  
12 term. Any trustee may be removed at any time by the  
13 governor and council for cause.’
