STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Bridge between Howland and Enfield.

EMERGENCY PREAMBLE. Whereas, the bridge across the Penobscot river between Howland and Enfield is out of repair and its condition such as to constitute a menace to the safety of travelers thereon and extensive repair thereof is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety;

And whereas, the foregoing facts constitute an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of this state; now therefore,

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the

2 sum of twenty-one thousand seven hundred dollars (\$21,-3 700.00) or as much thereof as may be necessary for 4 strengthening, replanking, painting and building a guard 5 rail on the Howland-Enfield bridge across the Penobscot 6 river; same to be expended under the direction of the state 7 highway commission.

EMERGENCY CLAUSE. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved. For statement of facts see original bill.
