STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to amend Section 30, of Chapter 64, of the Revised Statutes, relating to the Issuing of Burial and Transportation Permits by Sub-Registrars.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty of Chapter sixty-four of the Revised

2 Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the

3 word "two" in the first line of said section, the words 'or

4 more,' and by inserting after the word "permits" in the third

5 line of said section, the words, 'and permits for trans
6 portation of dead human bodies,' so that said section as

7 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 30. The town or city clerk may appoint two or 2 more suitable and proper persons, in each town or city, as 3 sub-registrars, who shall be authorized to issue burial per-4 mits, and permits for transportation of dead human bodies, 5 based upon a death certificate, as hereinbefore provided, in 6 the same manner as is required of the town or city clerk; 7 and the said death certificate upon which the permit is 8 issued shall be forwarded to the town clerk within six days 9 after receiving the same, and all permits by whomsoever to issued shall be returned to the town clerk as required by II section twenty-nine. The appointment of sub-registrars 12 shall be made with reference to locality, so as to best suit 13 the convenience of the inhabitants of the town, and such 14 appointment shall be in writing and recorded in the office 15 of the town or city clerk; the sub-registrars in any fown 16 shall hold office at the pleasure of the town clerk.'
