STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Clams in Machiasport.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. *Clams in Machiasport to be taken for commercial purposes by residents only.* It shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of the town of Machiasport in the county of Washington to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town.

Sect. 2. *Non-residents may take clams for home consumption.* Persons not residents of the town of Machiasport may be permitted to dig for clams for fish bait or home consumption within the limits of said town; provided, however, that no person shall dig for purposes mentioned in

6 this section during any one day more than one bushel of
7 clams.

Sect. 3. *Penalty for violation.* Whoever violates the pro-
2 visions of sections one and two of this act shall for each
3 offense be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five dol-
4 lars, or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days.
