HOUSE AMENDMENT "A"

Amend House Document number one hundred eighteen
2 by striking out the whole of said document, including the
3 title, and by substituting therefor the following:

AN ACT in Relation to the Several Examining Boards.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section forty-nine of chapter one hundred
2 seventeen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by add-
3 ing thereto the following words: 'if the appropriation is
4 sufficient therefor. Provided, that if the fees to be col-
5 lected under the provisions of section eleven of chapter
6 eighteen of the revised statutes are insufficient to pay the

7 salaries and expenses provided by this chapter, that the
8 members of said board shall only be entitled to a pro rata
9 payment for salary in any year in which such fees are in-
10 sufficient;’ so that said section, as amended, shall read as
11 follows :

‘Sect. 49. The members of the board of registration in
2 medicine shall receive annual salaries of one hundred dol-
3 lars each, except the secretary, who shall receive three hun-
4 dred dollars a year; in addition each member shall receive
5 necessary traveling expenses in attending the meetings of
6 the board. Extra compensation for each day actually spent
7 in investigation or prosecution of complaints and cases un-
8 der section fourteen of chapter eighteen of the revised
9 statutes, shall be allowed to each member of the board ac-
10 tually engaged therein, if the appropriation is sufficient
11 therefor; provided, that if the fees to be collected under
12 the provisions of section eleven of chapter eighteen of the
13 revised statutes are insufficient to pay the salaries and ex-
14 penses provided by this chapter, that the members of said
15 board shall only be entitled to a pro rata payment for salary
16 in any year in which such fees are insufficient.’

Sect. 2. Section fifty-two of chapter one hundred seven-
2 teen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding
3 after the word “examiners,” in the second line thereof, the
4 words ‘board of osteopathic examination,’ also by adding
5 at the end of said section the following words: ‘provided,
6 that if the fees are insufficient to pay the per diem and ex-

7 penses a pro rata payment shall be made to the members
8 of said boards for per diem not exceeding the appropria-
9 tion,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 52. The members of the board of dental examin-
2 ers, board of osteopathic examination, commissioners of
3 pharmacy, veterinary examiners, board of accountancy and
4 the examiners of applicants for admission to the bar, shall
5 each receive as compensation for their services five dollara
6 a day for the time actually spent and their necessary ex-
7 penses incurred in the discharge of their duties to be certi-
8 fied by the secretaries of their respective boards; provided,
9 that if the fees are insufficient to pay the per diem and ex-
10 penses a pro rata payment shall be made to the members
11 of said boards for per diem not exceeding the appropria-
12 tion.'
