STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Two of Chapter Thirty-four of the Revised Statutes as Amended by Chapter Eighty-one of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Twenty-one Relating to the Duties of the Commissioner of Agriculture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter thirty-four of the revised statutes

as amended by chapter eighty-one of the public laws of

nineteen hundred twenty-one is hereby further amended

by striking out in the twentieth line of said section two, the

words "three thousand dollars annually shall be made," and

substituting therefor the following: 'six thousand dollars

for the year nineteen hundred twenty-four and six thousand

8 dollars for the year nineteen hundred twenty-five is hereby 9 made and provided,' so that the said section two as amended 10 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. The commissioner of agriculture shall by per-2 sonal observation, investigation and correspondence, ac-3 quaint himself with the methods and wants of practical 4 husbandry, the means of fertilization, and the adaption of 5 various products to the soils and climate of the state; also 6 with the progress of scientific and practical agriculture else-7 where, with a view to the more complete development of 8 the natural resources of the state; he shall gather statistics of information concerning agriculture and publish the same 10 annually; he shall assist the farmers of the state, in so far II as is practicable, to secure farm help, and to promote in-12 creased production of farm crops through the selection, 13 the growing and the dissemination of superior strains of 14 seeds. He may investigate and furnish statements to 15 shippers and other interested parties as to the quality and 16 condition of fruits, vegetables, dairy and other perishable 17 farm products when received within the state for intra-18 state or interstate commerce, under such rules and regu-19 lations as he may prescribe, including payment of such fees 20 as will be reasonable and as nearly as may be to cover the 21 cost for the service rendered. Provided, that statements 22 so issued by the authorized agents of the department shall 23 be received in all courts of the State of Maine as prima 24 facie evidence of the truth of the statements therein con25 tained. An appropriation of six thousand dollars for the 26 year nineteen hundred twenty-four and six thousand dol-27 lars for the year nineteen hundred twenty-five is hereby 28 made and provided, to be expended by the commissioner of 29 agriculture for the purpose of carrying out the provisions 30 of this section and of section six of this chapter, and for 31 such other purposes and in such manner as in his judgment 32 will best promote the interests of agriculture in this state.
