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**STATE OF MAINE**

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

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AN ACT in Relation to the Several Examining Boards.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section forty-nine, of chapter one hundred  
2 seventeen, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by  
3 adding thereto the following words: 'If the appropriation  
4 is sufficient therefor. Provided, that if the fees to be col-  
5 lected, under the provisions of section eleven of chapter  
6 eighteen, of the revised statutes, are insufficient to pay the  
7 salaries and expenses provided by this chapter, that the  
8 members of said board shall only be entitled to a pro rata  
9 payment for salary in any year in which such fees are

10 insufficient;’ so that said section as amended shall read as  
11 follows:

‘Sect. 49. The members of the board of registration in  
2 medicine shall receive annual salaries of one hundred dol-  
3 lars each, except the secretary, who shall receive three  
4 hundred dollars a year; in addition each member shall re-  
5 ceive necessary traveling expenses in attending the meet-  
6 ings of the board. Extra compensation for each day actual-  
7 ly spent in investigation or prosecution of complaints and  
8 cases under section fourteen, of chapter eighteen, of the re-  
9 vised statutes, shall be allowed to each member of the  
10 board actually engaged therein, if the appropriation is suffi-  
11 cient therefor; Provided, that if the fees to be collected  
12 under the provisions of section eleven, of chapter eighteen,  
13 of the revised statutes, are insufficient to pay the salaries  
14 and expenses provided by this chapter, that the members  
15 of said board shall only be entitled to a pro rata payment  
16 for salary in any year in which such fees are insufficient.’

Sect. 2. Section fifty-two of chapter one hundred seven-  
2 teen, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding  
3 after the word “examiners,” in the second line thereof, the  
4 words ‘board of osteopathic examination,’ also by adding at  
5 the end of said section the following words: ‘Provided, that  
6 if the fees are insufficient to pay the per diem and expenses  
7 a pro rata payment shall be made to the members of said  
8 boards for per diem not exceeding the appropriation,’ so  
9 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 52. The members of the board of dental examiners, board of osteopathic examination, commissioners of pharmacy, veterinary examiners, board of accountancy and the examiners of applicants for admission to the bar, shall each receive as compensation for their services five dollars a day, for the time actually spent, and their necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties to be certified by the secretaries of their respective boards; Provided, that if the fees are insufficient to pay the per diem and expenses a pro rata payment shall be made to the members of said boards for per diem not exceeding the appropriation.’
