STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Free High Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Upon written approval by the state commissioner of edu2 cation and the written recommendation of the superintend3 ing school committee, any town in which conditions exist,
4 because of the fact that all its pupils can not be accommo5 dated by its Class A, Class B, or junior high school or be6 cause of the fact that pupils may reside so great a distance
7 from said high school that they can more reasonably be
8 provided for in high schools in other towns, may, at a regu9 lar or special town meeting and annually thereafter, vote
10 to send such pupils to other high schools, in other towns;

11 make special appropriation therefor, and from said appro-12 priation pay the necessary tuition, said tuition rates and13 other conditions relative thereto to be in accordance with14 those established under the general law.
