STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Two, Chapter Thirty-three, Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, Relating to the Sanitation of School Houses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter thirty-three of the public laws of
2 nineteen hundred twenty-one is hereby amended by striking
3 out all of said section and inserting in place thereof the
4 following:

‘Sect. 2. All school buildings or buildings used for school
2 purposes shall be provided with toilet facilities that shall be
3 installed in such manner and location as to insure privacy,
4 cleanliness and supervision by teachers and that shall meet

5 at least one of the minimum requirements as hereinafter
6 stated. Such toilet facilities shall be installed by each city
7 and town in at least one of its school buildings each year
8 following the passage of this Act, and all such buildings
9 in every city and town of the state shall be equipped with
10 such facilities by the first day of January, nineteen hundred
11 and thirty-one.

‘(a) Flush water closets connected with sewer, filter bed,
2 septic tank or protected cesspool, with separate compart-
3 ments for the sexes, accessible only by separate passage-
4 ways from school room or corridors.

‘(b) Chemical closets, of such types and manufacture as
2 shall be approved by the state superintendent of public
3 schools, with separate compartments for the sexes, access-
4 ible only by separate passageways from school rooms or
5 corridors.

‘(c) Privies located in adjacent buildings, provided with
2 separate compartments for the sexes, accessible by open,
3 separate passageways from school rooms or corridors and
4 constructed in such manner that vault of said privy shall
5 be thirty feet or more from nearest school room and next
6 the outside wall of building in which located.’
