STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Costs in Civil Actions in the Supreme Judicial and Superior Courts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

In all civil actions in the supreme judicial or any superior 2 courts, where final judgment is rendered otherwise than by 3 agreement, or upon a voluntary non-suit, or by default; 4 the court, upon motion of the prevailing party, may allow 5 to such party such a sum for counsel fees as to the court 6 may seem just and reasonable under all the circumstances 7 of each case, to be taxed and allowed as a part of the tax-8 able costs of court.
