STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter Three Hundred
and Fifty of the Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Fifteen,
Relative to Hours of Labor of Minors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter three hundred and fifty of the
2 public laws of nineteen hundred and fifteen is hereby
3 amended by striking out in the first and second lines the
4 words, "No male minor under sixteen years of age, and,"
5 and by adding to said section the following words, 'and no
6 male minor under sixteen years of age shall be employed in
7 any of the said establishments, or occupations more than
8 eight hours in any one day,' so that said section as amended
9 shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 1. No female shall be employed in any workshop,
2 factory, manufacturing or mechanical establishment or
3 laundry more than nine hours in any one day; except when
4 a different apportionment of the hours of labor is made for
5 the sole purpose of making a shorter day’s work for one
6 day of the week; and in no case shall the hours of labor
7 exceed fifty-four in a week. And no male minor under six-
8 teen years of age shall be employed in any of the said
9 establishments or occupations more than eight hours in any
10 one day.’
