IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Two of Chapter Twenty-two of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Purchase of Sewers by Towns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section two of chapter twenty-two of the revised statutes
2 is hereby amended by adding to said section the following:
3 'Towns which have a public water supply may also pur4 chase any existing private sewer within said town and ap5 propriate money to pay for the same,' so that said section
6 as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. The municipal officers of a town, or a commit-2 tee duly chosen by the town, may, at the expense of the

3 town, construct public drains or sewers along or across any 4 public way therein; and through any lands of persons or 5 corporations, when they deem it necessary for public con-6 venience or health; but neither the municipal officers of 7 the town, nor such committee, shall construct any public 8 sewer therein until the same shall be authorized by vote of 9 said town, and an appropriation made for the purpose; and 10 when constructed such sewers shall be under the control 11 of the municipal officers. Towns which have a public water 12 supply may also purchase any existing private sewer within 13 said town and appropriate money to pay for the same.'
