STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Eight of Chapter Forty-eight of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Local Sealers of Weights and Measures.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter sixty-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred 2 and seventeen amending section eight of chapter forty-eight 3 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and section eight 4 of chapter forty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby re- 5 enacted, so that section eight of chapter forty-eight shall 6 read as follows:

'Sect. 8. The municipal officers of each town shall an- 2 nually in the month of April appoint a sealer of weights

3 and measures, not necessarily a resident therein, removable
4 at pleasure, and may fill vacancies; and for each month
5 that said municipal officers neglect this duty they severally
6 shall forfeit ten dollars. Within ten days after each such
7 appointment the clerk of each city or town shall communi-
8 cate the name of the person so appointed to the state sealer
9 of weights and measures, and for the neglect of this duty
10 shall forfeit ten dollars. Such sealer of weights and meas-
11 ures in any town may be sealer for several adjoining towns
12 if such is the pleasure of the municipal officers therein, pro-
13 vided such action receives the approval of the state sealer
14 of weights and measures.'
