IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Eighty-four of Chapter Sixteen of the Revised Statutes Relating to Contracts with Academies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section eighty-four of chapter sixteen of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word "tui3 tion" and substituting therefor the words 'schooling of
4 pupils' where said word occurs and by striking out the
5 words "the eleven preceding sections" and substituting
6 therefor the words 'section seventy-three of this chapter'
7 and by striking out the words "when such contract has been
8 made with the trustees of an academy, a joint committee

9 for the selection of teachers and the arrangement of the 10 course of study in such academy shall include the superin-11 tending school committees of the contracting towns with 12 an equal number of members of the board of trustees of 13 such academy when such academy has less than twenty-five 14 thousand dollars endowment' and substituting therefor the 15 following: 'when the amount to be paid under the contract 16 shall equal or exceed the income of the academy for the 17 preceding year, exclusive of sums paid said academy by 18 the contracting town, a joint committee shall be formed 19 consisting of the superintending school committee of said 20 town and an equal number of the trustees of the academy. 21 Said joint committee shall be empowered to select and 22 employ the teachers for the academy, to fix salaries, to 23 arrange the course of study, to supervise the instruction 24 and to formulate and enforce proper regulations pertaining 25 to the educational activities of the school. The superin-26 tendent of schools of the contracting town in which the 27 academy is located shall be secretary ex-officio of the joint 28 committee and shall be assigned such supervisory duties 29 in connection with the school as the joint committee shall 30 determine. When a town has made a contract as provided 31 for in this section the tuition liability of said town shall be 32 the same as if a free high school were maintained in ac-33 cordance with section seventy-three of this chapter,' so that 34 the section when amended shall read as follows:

'Any town which does not maintain a free high school of

2 standard grade may, from year to year, authorize its super-3 intending school committee to contract with and pay the 4 superintending school committee of any adjoining town or 5 the trustees of any academy located within such town or in 6 an adjoining town, for the schooling of pupils within said 7 town in the studies contemplated by section seventy-three 8 of this chapter. When the amount to be paid under the 9 contract shall equal or exceed the income of the academy 10 for the preceding year, exclusive of sums paid said academy 11 by the contracting town, a joint committee shall be formed 12 consisting of the superintending school committee of said 13 town and an equal number of the trustees of the academy. 14 Said joint committee shall be empowered to select and 15 employ the teachers for the academy, to fix salaries, to 16 arrange the course of study, to supervise the instruction 17 and to formulate and enforce proper regulations pertaining 18 to other educational activities of the school. The superin-19 tendent of schools of the contracting town in which the 20 academy is located shall be secretary ex-officio of the joint 21 committee and shall be assigned such supervisory duties in 22 connection with the school as the joint committee shall 23 determine upon. When a town has made a contract as 24 provided for in this section the tuition liability of said town 25 shall be the same as if a free high school were maintained 26 in accordance with section seventy-three of this chapter, 27 and the expenditure of any town for schooling of pupils as 28 provided in this section shall be subject to the same con-

29 ditions and shall entitle such town to the same state aid as 30 if it had made such expenditure for a free high school.'
