RESOLVE, in Favor of Blanch A. Grant, for State Pension,

Resolved: That the sum of fifteen dollars per month be

- 2 paid to Blanch A. Grant, helpless daughter of Horace S.
- 3 Grant, of Winn, Maine, late a soldier of Company D,
- 4 Twenty-second Regiment, to be paid quarterly from the
- 5 fund appropriated for military pensions, beginning January
- 6 first, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, and continuing
- 7 during the pleasure of the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The said Blanch A. Grant, daughter of the late soldier, Horace S. Grant, of Co. D, 22nd Me., has been a cripple since infancy, being unable to stand alone without the aid of a cane. The applicant is unable to earn a living, due not only to her crippled condition, but to diminution of her mental capacity. Blanch A. Grant is 34 years old.
