STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Twenty-seven of Chapter Two Hundred and Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred and Forty-four of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, and by Chapter One Hundred and Ninety-six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, and by Chapter Two Hundred and Eighteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, Relating to Use of Traps, Spears and Nets in Taking Fish in Inland Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section twenty-seven of chapter two hundred and nine2 teen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, 3 as amended by chapter two hundred and forty-four of the 4 public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, and by 5 chapter one hundred and ninety-six of the public laws of 6 nineteen hundred and nineteen, and by chapter two hun-7 dred and eighteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred 8 and twenty-one, is hereby amended by striking out all of 9 said section and by substituting in place thereof the follow-10 ing section:

'Sect. 27. The commissioner of inland fisheries and game 2 may grant permits to take suckers, eels, hornpouts and 3 yellow perch, by means of eel pots, traps, spears or nets, 4 in inland waters frequented by these fish, under such terms, 5 rules and regulations as he may establish, but no exclusive 6 territory permits shall be granted for the taking of any of 7 said fish in any inland waters.

'Provided, further, that said commissioner may grant per-2 mits to take alewives in the inland waters of the state un-3 der such rules and regulations as he may establish.

'It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill, 2 destroy, have in possession, offer for transportation or 3 transport any alewives, suckers, eels, hornpouts or yellow 4 perch in violation of any provision of this section, under 5 a penalty of thirty dollars and costs for each offense.'
