STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Establish a Close Time on Lobsters from a Point in a Straight Line from Bear Cove on the Western Side of Petit Manan Point to Little Black Ledge Directly North of Moulton's Ledge Spar Buoy to the Schoodic Island Whistling Buoy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person or persons shall set any traps or other devices
2 used for catching lobsters between the first day of July,
3 and nine A. M. August thirty-first of each year, under pen-
4 alty of five dollars for each trap, or other device set within
5 the following described limits: Beginning at a point in the
6 straight line from Bear Cove, on the western side of Petit

7 Manan point, to Little Black Ledge, directly north of Moul-
 8 ton's Ledge spar buoy, thence directly south to said Moul-
 9 ton's Ledge spar buoy, thence due south from said Moul-
 10 ton's Ledge spar buoy two nautical miles; thence in a west-
 11 erly direction in a straight line to a point two miles due
 12 south of Schoodic Island whistling buoy, thence due north
 13 to said Schoodic Island whistling buoy.
