STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Forty-two of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes as Amended by Chapter One Hundred Seventy-three of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seventeen, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Fourteen and Chapter Two Hundred Forty-one of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nineteen, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Twenty-one, in Relation to Salaries and Expenses of County Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. Chap. 117, Sec. 42; 1917, Chap. 173; 1919, Chap.
2 214; 1919, Chap. 241; 1921, Chap. 219; relating to salaries

3 and expenses of county commissioners, amended. Section 4 forty-two of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the re-5 vised statutes as amended by chapter one hundred seventy-6 three of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, 7 as amended by chapters two hundred fourteen and two 8 hundred forty-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred o nineteen, as amended by chapter two hundred nineteen of 10 the public laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one, is hereby II amended by striking out all of said section after the words 12 "York, eight hundred and fifty dollars," in the nineteenth 13 line and inserting the following: 'Said salaries shall be in 14 full for all services, expenses and travel, including the 15 management of the jails and work shops and the sale of 16 their products, except actual necessary cash expenses in-17 curred outside of their respective counties for the trans-18 action of official business; and expenses incurred at public 19 hearings away from the county seat; all bills for such ex-20 penses shall be approved by the clerk of courts and the 21 county attorney of their county; excepting also, such ex-22 penses as are provided for in section twenty-six of chapter 23 eighty-three of the revised statutes,' so that said section 24 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 42. Expenses incurred at public hearings away 2 from the county seat to be allowed. The county commissioners in the several counties shall receive annual salaries 4 from the treasuries of the counties in monthly payments 5 paid on the last day of each month, as follows:

'Androscoggin, seven hundred fifty dollars.

'Aroostook, eleven hundred dollars.

'Cumberland, fifteen hundred dollars.

'Franklin, four hundred fifty dollars.

'Hancock, seven hundred fifty dollars.

'Kennebec, one thousand dollars.

'Knox, four hundred dollars.

'Lincoln, three hundred dollars.

'Oxford, six hundred dollars.

'Penobscot, twelve hundred dollars.

'Piscataquis, five hundred dollars.

'Sagadahoc, four hundred dollars.

'Somerset, six hundred fifty dollars.

'Waldo, four hundred dollars.

'Washington, six hundred fifty dollars.

'York, eight hundred fifty dollars.

'Said salaries shall be in full for all services, expenses and 2 travel, including the management of the jails and work

3 shops and the sale of their products, except actual neces-

4 sary cash expenses incurred outside of their respective

5 counties for the transaction of official business; and expenses

6 incurred at public hearings away from the county seat; all

7 bills for such expenses shall be approved by the clerk of

8 courts and the county attorney of their county; excepting

9 also, such expenses as are provided for in section twenty-

10 six of chapter eighty-three of the revised statutes.'
