STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Fifty-eight of Chapter Four of the
Revised Statutes Relating to the Purposes for Which Cities
and Towns May Raise Money.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty-eight of chapter four of the revised statutes
2 is hereby amended by adding after the words "Memorial
3 Day" in the fifth line thereof the words 'Armistice Day, or
4 any other day set apart for patriotic commemoration,' so
5 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 58. *Other purposes for which cities and towns may*
2 *raise money.* R. S., c. 4, §72. 1905, c. 96. 1909, c. 160 1915,
3 c. 280. Cities and towns may raise money to procure the

4 writing and publication of their histories, to celebrate any
5 centennial or other anniversary of the settlement or incor-
6 poration of such city or town, and to publish the proceedings
7 of any such celebration; to defray the expenses of the
8 observance of memorial day, armistice day, or any other day
9 set apart for patriotic commemoration, firemen's memorial
10 Sunday, and of old home week; and a sum not exceeding
11 five thousand dollars in any one town for erecting a suitable
12 monument in memory of the soldiers and sailors who sacri-
13 ficed their lives in defense of their country in the war of
14 eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and a reasonable sum to
15 secure, grade and care for a lot appropriate for such a
16 monument. They may also raise money to be expended for
17 exterminating or controlling brown-tail and gipsy moths and
18 other insect pests.
