STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Incorporate the Union Ferry Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Benjamin M. Seabury, Walter S. Crandall,
2 Alice M. Crandall, Edgar E. Rounds and Edward W. Baker,
3 and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby cre-
4 ated a body politic and corporate by the name of the Union
5 Ferry Company with power by that name to sue and be
6 sued, to have and use a common seal, to establish suitable
7 by-laws and regulations for the proper management of its
8 affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the state, and to exer-
9 cise and enjoy all the powers and privileges incident to
10 regular corporations.

Sect. 2. The capital stock of said company shall not be
2 less than fifty thousand dollars, and shall be divided into
3 shares of ten dollars each.

Sect. 3. Said corporation is hereby granted the exclusive
2 right and privilege to establish, set up and maintain, a steam
3 or power ferry over the waters of Casco bay from the town
4 landing in the town of Falmouth, or any other landing in
5 said town owned or controlled by said company, to some
6 suitable landings on Chebeague island, Long island and
7 Littlejohn island, all in Cumberland county, with boats to
8 be propelled by steam or other motor power, such boats
9 to be suitable and convenient for public use. All rights and
10 duties herein mentioned shall be exercised and performed
11 in accordance with all the applicable provisions of chapter
12 fifty-five of the revised statutes, and acts amendatory there-
13 of or additional thereto.

Sect. 4. Said boats shall be maintained and operated for
2 the conveyance of passengers and freight during the months
3 of June, July, August and September, and during such
4 other portion of the year as said company may determine.

Sect. 5. Any one person named in the first section of
2 this act may call the first meeting of this corporation by
3 giving notice to each of the others by registered mail, seven
4 (7) days at least before the time of said meeting, specify-
5 ing the place and time of such meeting.
