STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, to Provide a Teacher's Pension of One Hundred Fifty Dollars a Year for Fannie Marble.

Resolved: That there is hereby granted to Fannie Marble 2 a teacher's retirement pension of one hundred fifty dollars 3 annually as provided by law for teachers who have made 4 teaching their life work for twenty-five years and that the 5 state superintendent of public schools be authorized to grant 6 said pension quarterly as is customary for teachers who are 7 retired under provisions of the law.

BILL OF PARTICULARS

Miss Fannie Marble began teaching in eighteen hundred sixty-six and retired in eighteen hundred ninety-one on account of physical and mental condition. She taught continuously during that time. Her physical and mental condition before reaching the age of sixty was such that she was unable to secure a record of all her services, required for the granting of pension. Miss Marble has no living immediate relatives who can take care of her, has no means of support and is in want. The state superintendent of public schools finds Miss Marble eligible to receive the pension above mentioned, provided the evidence could be established from record, but her condition makes it impossible for her to produce the data necessary.
