STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Plug Fishing for Landlocked Salmon and Trout in Mooselucmaguntic and the Richardson Lakes, in the Counties of Oxford and Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

So much of the existing regulations promulgated by the
2 department of inland fisheries and game as prohibits plug
3 fishing, so-called, from permanent wharf or shore, for land4 locked salmon and trout in Mooselucmaguntic lake and in
5 the Richardson lakes, which waters are situated in the
6 counties of Oxford and Franklin, from June first of each
7 year until September thirtieth following of each year, both
8 days inclusive, is hereby revoked, but all other plug fishing

9 in any of said waters is hereby prohibited under the same 10 penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for 11 fishing in closed waters.
