STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE**

AN ACT to Amend Section Eighty-six of Chapter Two Hundred Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seventeen, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Forty-four of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen and by Chapter One Hundred and Forty-two of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen and by Chapter Ninety-three of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, Relating to the Disposition of Money Collected under the Provisions of the Inland Fish and Game Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eighty-six of chapter two hundred and nineteen

2 of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, as
3 amended by chapter two hundred and forty-four of the
4 public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, and by
5 chapter one hundred and forty-two of the public laws of
6 nineteen hundred and nineteen and by chapter ninety-three
7 of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, is
8 hereby amended by striking out all of said section and by
9 substituting therefor the following section :

'Sect. 86. All fines and penalties recovered and money
2 received or collected under any provision of this chapter,
3 or amendment thereof, or for the sale of seized fish or game,
4 or fur-bearing animals, or parts thereof, after deducting le-
5 gal taxable costs, shall be paid within thirty days by the per-
6 son receiving the same to the commissioner of inland fish-
7 eries and game, at Augusta, Maine, to be paid by him to the
8 treasurer of state.

Any officer or other person who shall receive any fine or
2 penalty, or any part thereof, for the violation of any inland
3 fish or game law, or any fees for licenses issued by virtue
4 of this chapter, or amendment thereof, and shall neglect
5 for more than thirty days to pay the same to the commis-
6 sioner of inland fisheries and game, as herein provided, shall
7 pay a fine of not less than fifty, nor more than one hundred
8 dollars and costs of prosecution for each offense.'
