STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Provide for the Construction of Gravel Roads in all Cases Except Where a Different Type of Construction is Especially Authorized.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: In the construction of roads within the State of Maine, of 2 whatever class, in the construction of which any state funds 3 are used, the surfacing material in the original construction 4 and any resurfacing shall be gravel, except that in cases 5 where the state highway commission deem the same advis-6 able or necessary, oil, tarvia or similar substance may be 7 used upon such surface for protection. In case said com-8 mission deem it necessary to employ a different type of

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9 surface material than gravel, they shall present locations, 10 specifications and estimates of cost to the roads committee 11 or highway committee of the governor's council who are 12 hereby authorized to permit such construction if in their 13 judgment such a type of surface material is necessary, and 14 direct the state highway commission to depart from the 15 standard gravel construction herein provided for.
