To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the Eighty-first Legislature:

I submit herewith my report covering the financial operations of the State for the eighteen months' period January 1, 1921 to June 30, 1922. The fiscal year was changed by the last Legislature from January 1-December 31, to July 1-June 30, and all departments, boards and commissions were required by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1921, to submit a report covering the eighteen months' period. The State institutions were already closing their accounts June 30th, having adopted this fiscal period in conformity to the requirements of Chapter 74, Public Laws of 1917. The new fiscal year is welcomed by nearly all the departments. The advantages of the new fiscal year are manifest, the following being the principal reasons why this change is in the interest of business-like methods:

1. Appropriations are now available during the sessions of the Legislature. Formerly the appropriations expired on December 31st, while the new appropriations made by the Legislature would not be available until April 1st, leaving a period of three months during which many of the State's creditors must wait for the payment of their accounts.

2. The departments are now enabled to make up their reports to July 1st preceding the session of the Legislature and to have such reports printed and ready for distribution near the beginning of the session, instead of having them delayed until late in the session.

3. State appropriations in activities undertaken in conjunction with the Federal Government, such as vocational education, co-operative agricultural extension, forestry, health and other matters, are now expended in like periods and are comparable, where formerly appropriated for different periods.

The Farm Lands Loan Commission of Maine, composed of the Governor, State Auditor, Commissioner of Agriculture, Forest Commissioner and State Superintendent of Public Schools, is considering an increasing number of applications for farm loans. The Commission on December 20, 1922, went on record in favor of lowering the interest rate from seven per cent. to five per cent. The original act, Chapter 303, Public Laws of 1917, provided for loans at five per cent. The act increasing the rate to seven per cent., Chapter 147, Public Laws of 1921, was never brought to the attention of the Commission and would have been opposed by it had it known it was being considered. The Commission believes that loans might be granted up to sixty per cent. of the value of the land and to twenty per cent. of the value of the buildings. We believe that the act is of real benefit to agriculture.

The Legislature of 1919 passed an act, Chapter 189, Public Laws, known as the Soldiers' Settlement Act. The personnel of the Commission to administer this is the same as that provided in the act creating the Farm Lands Loan Commission. The act contemplated co-operation on the part of the United States. I have had several applications from ex-soldiers of the late war who desire to take up farming in Maine under the provisions of this act. To date the United States has not enacted legislation authorizing co-operation of this State with the Federal Government. There is, however, pending in Congress an act known as the Smith-McNary act, the passage of which may result in co-operation between the United States and Maine. I urge that this be carefully considered by the Legislature and that our act of 1919 be amended, if necessary, so as to provide for co-operation in this important matter.

I recommend legislation in connection with the State's reservation on which stands Fort William Henry, the ancient paved streets and the old garrison house at Pemaquid, the site of one of the first English settlements in New England. The Fort William Henry Commission, so-called, has no legal status, having originally been authorized by an order of the Governor and Council, in 1907. The title of this property at Pemaquid is vested in the State. The State rebuilt the tower and a portion of the walls of the fort and also makes an annual appropriation for the salary of the custodian and for repairs. The resolves under which this construction was undertaken have no present force of law, and the State should formally take over the property by an act of the Legislature.

A serious omission in our session laws, and one that causes inquiry, especially from those in other States, is that they nowhere show when the acts and resolves therein contained become effective. A statute should provide that the Secretary of State shall place upon the title page the date on which the laws become effective. Emergency acts and resolves would, of course, be shown to be effective on the date of their approval, which date in all cases appears at the end of the chapter. This should also be made to apply to the published acts required to be printed in the newspapers of the State, under Section 54, Chapter 2, R. S.

I can see no good reason why the State should have towns and plantations with the same name, and I renew the recommendation made by my predecessor to change the names of some of the small plantations. We have, for instance, the town of Lincoln and Lincoln Plantation; town of Webster and Webster Plantation; town of Rangeley and Rangeley Plantation. To complete this confusion of names we have two plantations Number Twenty-one, one in Washington and one in Hancock County, both organized places, each with a board of assessors and a treasurer. This similarity in names causes much confusion in the various departments, and occasionally results in paying money to the wrong town or plantation.

My predecessor in his report to the seventy-ninth Legislature recommended a change in the law which exempts educational institutions from

paying over their income to the Treasurer of State. Under this act, Section 98, of Chapter 2, R. S., the six State normal schools pay a part of their expenses from income received for board of pupils and room rent of dormitories, this income being disbursed by the Department of Education without covering same into the Treasury, and the remainder from the appropriation for normal schools. This dual method of paying bills has always caused confusion. I wish to urge upon the Legislature the importance of enacting a law requiring all income of these institutions to be paid to the Treasurer, and all expenses to be paid from one appropriation.

There should be an act authorizing clerk hire in the office of the Attorney General and the Director of Sea and Shore Fisheries. Such authority has never been granted by statute for these departments.

Section 9, Chapter 29, R. S., provides that no soldier or sailor shall be considered a pauper. Section 7, of the same chapter outlines a procedure in case a soldier "becomes a pauper" after his connection with the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, has ceased. These two sections are entirely contradictory and should be reconciled.

In the revision of the statutes of 1916, the laws governing two of the State institutions, the Bath Military and Naval Orphan Asylum and the Maine School for the Deaf, were not brought within the statutes. These institutions are as much a part of the State's activities in their several lines as are any other of the State institutions. The reason for their omission from the completed revision is probably that when the acts passed making them State institutions, such acts were by error included in the classification of private and special rather than public acts. These should be embodied in the revised statutes in the next revision.

I believe that the law should be changed that requires two sets of ballots to be printed and distributed for the September election. The extra set is sent a few days after the first one, so that in case the first one is lost, the town will still have sufficient ballots. To show that this seems unnecessary, I need only cite the fact that the law providing for primary elections makes provision for one set of ballots only, and I have heard of no shortage of ballots at the primary elections. The express bill alone on the extra set in 1922 involved an extra expense of \$471.03.

The last Legislature passed an act, Chapter 151, Public Laws 1921, requiring a resident auditor at the University of Maine. In compliance with this act my predecessor appointed as resident auditor Mr. George H. Bangs, who has established a complete system of controls for carrying on the financial transactions at the University. All bills of that institution are now audited. In the past eighteen months more than a thousand dollars has been saved to the institution by cash discounts alone, while by painstaking economy the balance sheet for the year ending June 30, 1922, shows a net operating surplus of over \$12,000.00.
