IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Provide for Registration of Land Surveyors and
Their Marks

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All land surveyors shall, under penalty of a
2 fine of fifty dollars for failure to do so, register with the
3 land agent of the state the marks used by them to identify
4 their work. These marks shall be available during ordi-
5 nary business hours for examination by any interested party,
6 and shall be so filed by the land agent as to be readily
7 accessible for that purpose.

Sect. 2. Land surveyors may, upon application to the

2 land agent and after having satisfied him of their ability
3 to handle such work efficiently, be licensed to practice land
4 surveying within the state of Maine. Such license shall
5 remain in force unless and until revoked for cause by the
6 land agent. A fee of two dollars, payable in advance, shall
7 be charged to cover the cost of the examination and license.
8 A roster of licensed surveyors shall be maintained by the
9 land agent, which shall be available during ordinary busi-
10 ness hours for examination by any interested party and
11 which shall be supplied by the land agent on request to
12 any one requesting information as to available surveyors.

Sect. 3. All fees and fines collected under this act shall
2 be payable to the treasurer of state. Any expenses incurred
3 by the land agent in making examinations, issuing licenses,
4 or otherwise enforcing the provisions of this act, shall on
5 requisition by the land agent and after approved by the
6 state auditor be paid out of the state treasury, provided that
7 the amounts so paid shall in no case exceed the total amount
8 received for the current year as fees and fines.
