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**STATE OF MAINE**

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**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE**

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**AN ACT to Change the Board of Directors of the Maine  
Institution for the Blind.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The board of directors of the Maine Institution for the Blind shall consist of eleven persons, six of whom shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the council, of which number the state superintendent of schools shall be one. The remaining five shall be by election of the said institution as now provided in its by-laws.

Sect. 2. The term of the state superintendent of schools as a director of the Maine Institution for the Blind shall

3 be coexistent with his term as such superintendent, the re-  
4 maining five appointed by the governor as aforesaid shall  
5 be for the overlapping terms as now held.

Sect. 3. The Maine Institution for the Blind may change  
2 its by-laws to cover this change in the law and a majority  
3 in number of directors appointed by the governor shall be  
4 a condition precedent to the money aid extended by the  
5 state.

Sect. 4. All acts or parts of acts and resolves inconsistent  
2 with this act are hereby repealed.
