STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to the Granting of Licenses for Certain
Businesses and Purposes by the Municipal Officers of the
City of Westbrook.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The municipal officers of the city of Westbrook
2 are hereby authorized to grant licenses for the following
3 businesses and purposes, in accordance with such rules and
4 regulations not inconsistent with law, and upon payment by
5 the licensee of such fees, as the city council of said city
6 may make and establish by ordinance, to wit: auctioneers,
7 gasoline tanks and pumps, and such other tanks and pumps
8 as are approved by the chief of the fire department of the

9 city, billiard tables, pool tables, bowling alleys, junk dealers,
10 peddlers, employment agencies, public carriages, automobiles
11 and taxicabs, having no specified routes or termini, and the
12 drivers or operators thereof, public wagons and trucks and
13 drivers or operators thereof, amusements, exhibitions and
14 performances, dealers in gasoline, dealers in explosives,
15 theatres, moving picture houses, inn-holders, victualers,
16 pawn brokers, lodging houses, (of five rooms or more) pub-
17 lic shooting galleries, dealers in fire works, public dance
18 halls, circuses, organ grinders, motor busses having specified
19 routes or termini, and the drivers or operators thereof, hand
20 carts or push carts, money lenders, bill distributors, and
21 ticket speculators.

Sect. 2. All acts, parts of acts, ordinances, parts of ordi-
2 nances, and provisions of charter, inconsistent with the
3 provisions hereof are hereby repealed.
