STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-five of Chapter Eight of
the Revised Statutes, Relating to Building of Camp Fires.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-five of chapter eight is hereby amended by
2 striking out the words "one-half of any fine imposed and
3 collected under this section shall be paid to the complain-
4 ant" in the ninth line of said section; and by substituting
5 in place thereof the following words: 'Whoever throws
6 away in the woods any lighted match, burning cigarette or
7 cigar stub, live fire from a pipe, or any other burning sub-
8 stance, or who is otherwise careless with fire in the woods

9 shall be subject on conviction to a fine of not less than ten
10 nor more than fifty dollars,' so that said section as amended
11 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 35. Whoever by himself, or by his servant, agent
2 or guide, or as the servant, agent or guide of any other
3 person, shall build a camp, cooking or other fire, or use an
4 abandoned camp, cooking or other fire, in or adjacent to
5 any woods in this state shall, before leaving such fire, to-
6 tally extinguish the same, and upon failure to do so, such
7 person shall be punished by a fine of fifty dollars, provided
8 that such fires built upon the sea beach in such situation
9 that they cannot spread into forest land, woodland, or cul-
10 tivated lands or meadows, shall not be construed as pro-
11 hibited by this section.

'Whoever throws away in the woods any lighted match,
2 burning cigarette or cigar stub, live fire from a pipe, or
3 any other burning substance, or who is otherwise careless
4 with fire in the woods shall be subject on conviction to a
5 fine of not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars.'
