STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Making It Unlawful for Any Person to Have Intoxicating Liquors in His Possession in Any Public Place.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to have any intoxicating liquors in his possession in any public place unless the same is held by virtue of a permit authorized by act of Congress.

For the purposes of this act all places shall be deemed public places except private homes which shall include that part of hotels, boarding and lodging houses used as a permanent residence.

Any person violating this act shall be punished by a fine

2 of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one
3 thousand dollars, or by imprisonment of not less than thirty
4 days nor more than six months, or by both fine and im-
5 prisonment. All municipal courts and trial justices shall
6 have jurisdiction for the purpose of enforcing this act.
