STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Giving to Attorneys at Law All Powers of Justices
of the Peace and Notaries Public.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Any attorney at law who is a member of the bar of the
2 state of Maine in good standing shall have the right to do
3 and perform all acts now authorized to be performed by
4 justices of the peace and notaries public. Said attorney at
5 law may have and use a seal in connection with said duties,
6 and all matters executed by him in connection with the
7 aforesaid duties shall be signed by him as "attorney at law."
