STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Appointing a Committee of Investigation to Procure Plans and Estimates for a State Library Building.

Resolved: That a committee of five to consist of the following: One appointed by the governor; one member of the senate to be appointed by the president of the senate; one member of the house to be appointed by the speaker of the house, the state librarian and the governor, who shall be chairman of said committee, shall be appointed to investigate and report to the next legislature in regard to plans, estimates and specifications for a state library building. The committee subject to the approval of the gov-

10 ernor and council may employ such assistance and incur
11 such expenses as it deems necessary not exceeding five
12 thousand dollars. The committee shall serve without pay
13 but shall receive its actual expenses.
