STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Sixty-four of Chapter Eighty-six of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Property Exempt from Attachment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
R. S., c. 86, s. 64; relating to property exempt from at-2 tachment and execution, amended. Paragraph V of sec-3 tion sixty-four of chapter eighty-six of the revised stat-4 utes is amended by adding after the words "All produce 5 of farms until harvested" the words 'not exceeding in value 6 five hundred dollars,' and by adding at the end of said 7 paragraph after the words "himself and family," the words 8 "This section does not authorize an attaching officer to dis-

9 turb growing crops, but such growing crops exceeding in 10 value five hundred dollars are not exempt and are not to 11 be considered exempt in court proceedings,' so that para-12 graph V of said section sixty-four reads as follows:

'V. All produce of farms until harvested not exceeding 2 in value five hundred dollars; one barrel of flour; corn and 3 grain necessary for himself and family, not exceeding thirty 4 bushels; all potatoes and other provisions raised or bought, 5 and necessary for himself and family; and all flax raised 6 on a half acre of land, and all articles manufactured there-7 from for the use of himself and family. This section does 8 not authorize an attaching officer to disturb growing crops, 9 but such growing crops exceeding in value five hundred 10 dollars are not exempt and are not to be considered exempt 11 in court proceedings.'
