STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Define the Phrase "Intoxicating Liquors."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The phrase "intoxicating liquors" as used in chapter one
2 hundred and twenty-seven of the revised statutes and all
3 amendments thereto, shall be construed to include alcohol,
4 brandy, whiskey, rum, gin, beer, ale, porter, wine, cider,
5 and any addition thereto in spirituous, vinous, malt or fer-
6 mented liquor, liquids and compounds whether medicated,
7 proprietary, patented or not, by whatever name called, con-
8 taining one-half of one per cent or more of alcohol by vol-
9 ume, which are fit for use or may be used for beverage
10 purposes.
