STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Two, Chapter One Hundred Eighteen, Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter One Hundred Twenty-five, Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Twenty-one, Relating to Fees of Trial Justices.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Subdivision four of section two, chapter one hundred

eighteen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter one

hundred twenty-five of the public laws of nineteen hundred

twenty-one, is hereby further amended by striking out the

words "eight cents" in the first line and inserting in place

thereof the words 'three dollars,' so that said subdivision

as amended shall read as follows:

'Trial of an issue, in a civil action, three dollars, and when 2 more than one day is used in the trial, two dollars for each 3 day, after the first, actually employed.'
