STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Maine State Prison at Thomaston for the Repair of Outside Buildings.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of five thousand dollars for the repair of buildings, 3 outside the prison enclosure of the Maine state prison and 4 belonging to the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The buildings outside the prison enclosure belonging to the state and used for storage purposes and as residences of the prison overseers and guards are badly in need of repair, having been neglected for many years. In the judgment of the warden and the board of prison commissioners good economy requires the within appropriation.
