STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Provide for the Construction of Gravel Roads
in All Cases Except Where a Different Type of Construc-
tion is Especially Authorized.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

In the construction of roads within the state of Maine,
2 of whatever class, in the construction of which any state
3 funds are used, the surfacing material in the original con-
4 struction and any resurfacing shall be gravel, except that
5 in cases where the state highway commission deem the same
6 advisable or necessary, oil, tarvia or similar substance may
7 be used upon such surface for protection. In case it is
8 deemed necessary to employ a different type of surface

9 material than gravel, the roads committee or highway com-
10 mittee of the governor's council is hereby authorized to
11 hold a hearing, after reasonable public notice, and if in the
12 judgment of such committee a type of surface material
13 other than gravel is necessary, said committee is hereby
14 authorized to determine the kind of surface material to be
15 used in the particular case and to authorize and direct the
16 state highway commission to depart from the standard
17 gravel construction herein provided for.
