STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE.

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred and Sixty-three, S. L. 1913, Relating to a Close Time on Lobsters in the Waters of Jonesport and Addison in Washington County, by Striking Out All of Said Act and Inserting in Place Thereof the Following:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

'No person or persons shall set any trap or other device
2 used for catching lobsters between the first day of July and
3 9 a. m., August 31st of each year under a penalty of five
4 dollars for each trap or other device set within the following
5 described limits: commencing at the spindle in Pleasant
6 river and running southwest by south, three and three-
7 fourths miles, abreast the buoy on Barton's ledge; thence

8 south by west one-fourth west, five and one-third miles;
9 thence east southwest, eight and one-fourth miles; thence
10 east three-fourths north to the whistling buoy off Moose
11 peak; thence northeast, seven and three-fourth miles, to a
12 point half the distance from Scabby island ledge to The
13 Brothers; thence north by west three-fourths west, one and
14 one-half miles; thence northwest, two and two-thirds miles;
15 thence northwest by west two miles; thence north by east,
16 three-fourths miles; thence west by north one-half north to
17 the head of Mason's bay.'
