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**STATE OF MAINE**

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

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AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred and Seventy-two,  
S. L. 1899, Relating to a Close Time on Lobsters in Pigeon  
Hill Bay in the Towns of Milbridge and Steuben, by Striking  
Out All of Said Act and Inserting in Place thereof the  
Following:

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

1 No person or persons shall set any trap or other device  
2 used for catching lobsters between the first day of July and  
3 9 a. m., August 31st of each year under a penalty of five  
4 dollars for each trap or other device set within the following  
5 described limits: commencing at Woods pond point on the  
6 west side of Pigeon Hill bay; thence easterly to the Nubble

7 on Little Boisbubert island; thence by the shore to the head  
8 of Boisbubert island; thence northerly to Joe Dyer's point,  
9 so-called; thence to the head of Pigeon Hill bay, aforesaid,  
10 thence by the shore to the first mentioned bound.'
