STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred and Twenty-one, S. L. 1915, as Amended by Chapter Eighty-nine, S. L. 1917, Relating to a Close Time on Lobsters in the Waters of Machias Bay and Adjacent Waters in the County of Washington, by Striking Out All of Said Section and Inserting in Place Thereof the Following:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

‘No person shall set any trap or other device used for
2 catching lobsters between July 1st and 9 a. m., August 31st
3 of each year under a penalty of five dollars for each trap
4 set within the following described limits: the easterly line
5 beginning at a point where the dividing line between the
6 towns of Machiasport and Whiting strikes the shore of

7 Holmes bay, and continuing on said dividing line to Town-
8 ship Rock, so-called, in said Holmes bay; thence running
9 south southwest two and three-fourths miles; thence south
10 southeast one-half mile; thence south by west three-fourths
11 west to the three mile limit; thence by said three mile limit
12 to a point three miles due south from the easternmost point
13 of Camp island otherwise known as The Brothers; the
14 westerly line beginning at Fan island at the mouth of the
15 Little Kennebec river, and running southerly to Hickeys
16 island; thence southerly to the easternmost point of Camp
17 island, otherwise known as The Brothers, and continuing
18 thence due south for a distance of three miles.'
