STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred Fifty-four, Special Laws Nineteen Hundred Fifteen, Relating to a Close Time on Lobsters in the Towns of Cutler, Trescott and Lubec, in Washington County, by striking out all of said act and inserting in place thereof the following:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person or persons shall set any trap or other device 2 used for catching lobsters between the first day of July and 3 nine A. M. September fourteenth of each year, under a 4 penalty of five dollars for each trap or other device set 5 within the following described limits: Commencing at Town-6 ship rock in said town of Cutler, thence running south

7 southwest, two and three-fourths miles; thence south south-8 east, one-half mile; thence south by west three-fourths west, 9 to the three-mile limit; thence running along said three-10 mile limit to a point three miles southeast from West 11 Quoddy Head.
