STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for the Purchase of Reports of the
Commemoration of a Century of Peace between the United
States and Canada of the Maine State Bar Association.

Resolved: That the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500)
2 is hereby appropriated for the purchase from the Maine
3 State Bar Association of copies of the Report of the Com-
4 memoration of a Century of Peace between the United
5 States and Canada of the said association which are to be
6 printed by it, at the same cost per copy as the cost to the
7 association; said volumes to be distributed or exchanged
8 at the discretion of the state librarian.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

A celebration in Maine of the Century of Peace between the United States and Canada was planned at the time of the World War but was not carried out because of that war. The Maine State Bar Association made its meeting in January, 1923, a commemoration of this peace, Mr. Justice William R. Riddell of the Supreme Court of Ontario bringing the message of Canada. This meeting is the only celebration in Maine of the historical peace. The reports of this meeting will be of much value to the State of Maine and promotive of good will between the two countries.

The appropriation is to purchase while the report of the celebration is being printed by the association additional copies at cost for distribution and exchange by the state library with the libraries of Maine and other states.
