STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter Eighty-two of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Supreme Judicial Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter eighty-two of the revised statutes

- 2 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "justices"
- 3 in the second line the words 'and such active retired jus-
- 4 tices as may be appointed and serving on said court,' so
- 5 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. I. The supreme judicial court shall consist of a 2 chief justice and seven associate justices, and such active 3 retired justices as may be appointed and serving on said

- 4 court, learned in the law and of sobriety of manners, who
- 5 shall be conservators of the peace throughout the state,
- 6 and may act in any case, although the county in which
- 7 they reside or own property is interested therein.'
