STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Making It Unlawful for Any Person to Have Intox-
icating Liquors in His Possession in Any Public Place.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person, except an agent of
2 enforcement who is lawfully in possession of intoxicating
3 liquors to be used as evidence, to have in his possession in
4 any public place any intoxicating liquors unless duly licensed
5 under a written permit authorized by act of congress.

For the purposes of this act every place shall be deemed a
2 public place except a dwelling house or that part of a hotel,
3 boarding or lodging house used as a permanent residence.

Any person who violates this act shall be punished by a

2 fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than
3 one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not less than
4 thirty days nor more than six months, or both by fine and
5 imprisonment. All municipal courts and trial justices shall
6 have jurisdiction of all violations under this act.
